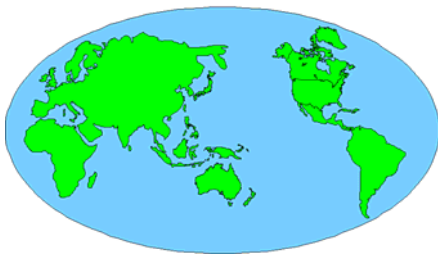

Tennis Guest Fees



This year we are making a better effort to keep up with our guest fees, both for using the pool and the tennis courts. As a reminder, members who bring non-member guests to use the club facilities are responsible for a \$1 per person per day fee for their guests; a modest fee to share our wonderful club with others. Also please remember that we are all on the honor system when registering guests.

We have come up with a (hopefully) simple way of tracking this and would like you all to use this when you have non-member guests playing on our courts. When you sign up for using the courts, you now write your name on the signup sheet along with an arrow showing how long you have reserved a court. When you arrive with your guests, simply write in the number of non-member guests in your party by your name on the signup sheet and circle it.

We'll collect the sheets each week and you will be billed for your pool and tennis guest fees on a quarterly basis.

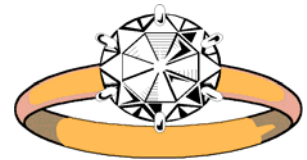
Member News
