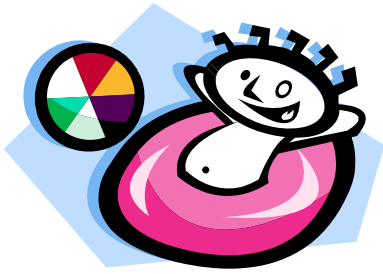
A Message from the Board of Directors

Pool Reminders: If a member needs to ask the guards for information or non-emergency assistance, please try to do so during the adult swim times.

Pool Parties: If a member is interested in having a pool party, please know that parties are to be scheduled not less than one (1) week in advance, and payment must be received before that deadline, as well. Guards have pool party forms down in guard office at the pool or they can be obtained through Charles Cantey. Cost for providing extra guards to cover attendees is included on form. If you have any questions about scheduling a pool party contact Charles Cantey or our head lifeguard.

Lap Swimming: Lap swimming for adults is available Sunday through Thursdays from 7:00 till close. Just ask the lifeguard or another member knowledgeable about this to help put lane rope in place when you arrive.

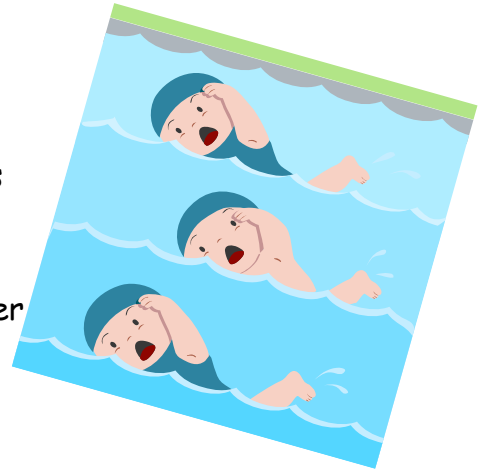

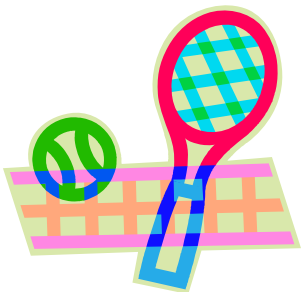

New Tennis Viewing Stands

For club members who are relatively new, you never got to enjoy the old viewing stands on the hill side of the tennis courts. They were destroyed during the tornado, and we didn't have enough money to replace them when the clubhouse, pool area and tennis courts were rebuilt in 1999. We plan to change that this year.

The goal is to have new viewing stands built before Labor Day weekend. The \$480 from the Memorial Day Tournament is a jump start to get the remaining money raised to pay for the stands. This major capital expense is not in the club budget, and we will need to raise the money in advance. The budget is expected to be between \$1000 and \$1500 depending on the design elements of the stands. That cost is for materials only, as the labor to build the stands will come from club volunteers. Consider this "Habitat for Tennis Humanity."

The new tennis habitat / viewing stands planning committee is John Turner, Mark Lange and Christos Kiriazis. They plan to present a preliminary design and budget to the board at the next meeting on July 6. Prior to that time they are soliciting input from club members on what should be included in the design. That input will help shape the design of the stands. The committee is also soliciting ideas for additional fund raising activities over the summer months to pay for the materials.

We are all very excited about this and think it will provide an excellent addition to our tennis facility, and make watching tennis even more enjoyable.
